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Bredex bought by McGraw-Hill division

A division of McGraw-Hill Cos. Inc. has acquired the assets of Nashville-based Bredex Corp., an education technology company founded by former Nashville mayor and current gubernatorial candidate Phil Bredesen.

Bredex, a Web-based system for tracking and improving student performance in the K-6 market, will be integrated into the McGraw-Hill Digital Learning unit of McGraw-Hill Education following the acquisition.

Financial terms of the transaction were not disclosed.
